







NOTE: Silverdale more or less mirrors national age structure (small spike in University student age group reflects proximity to Keele campus)







NOTE: Neighbouring parishes to S and W of Keele deviate form national age structure in reduced number of young working age and increased number in retirement age groups









NOTES: 1) Keele's raw census population figure is dominated by student numbers. From point of view of Neighbourhood Plan this figure is meaningless without correction to exclude excess number in 15 - 30 age group caused by students. 2) When student numbers are excluded Keele population mirrors national trend more closely than Madeley trend, with peaks in 25-30 and 45-50 age groups representing anomalies caused by age profile of University staff



NOTES: If taken at face value Keele's population invites comparison with Madeley or Silverdale. Elimination of the population anomaly caused by stdent numbers shows that this is entirely misleading. In terms of household numbers and "permanent resident" population Keele is much more closely comparable with Betley (i.e. a true rural village rather than a rural hub or suburban settlement)



Household types (KNP questionnaire responses)










Reasons for living in Keele - 2




Question 9: Do you work outside the parish? If yes, how far do you travel to work?




